Zimzala K9 Training rules and regulations

We kindly request that you keep the following in mind and for the safety of all on the property, strictly adhere to these guidelines when visiting or attending Zimzala K9 Training.

- Dogs that are not enrolled in classes are NOT allowed on the premises.
- All our visiting dogs should be on lead at all times, unless under direct supervision of your puppy instructor and requested to release them for off lead activities.
- When meeting another puppy or dog on lead, keep a respectful distance and if they do greet, do the “1-2-3 seconds hello” and move on.
- Do not approach a benched dog i.e., a dog tethered to a stake, pole or benching area. (Dog without its owner/handler)
- If you need to bench your dog (to visit the bathroom, get something from your car or go to the shop), always do so away from moving vehicles or passing dogs – enquire about suitable benching areas.
- Whilst attending training classes visitors have access to indicated training areas only – no dogs are allowed to run and play in other training/play camps, even if they are empty.
- Zimzala K9 Hotel Facilities and Residential Areas are off limits to all visitors – kindly take note of all access sign boards.
- Whilst children are welcomed at our facilities, parents must please ensure that they don’t disrupt classes or distract dogs from their training.
- Children are not allowed to play or clamber on fences, training and class equipment.
- Please always be aware of and clean up behind your dog. If you forgot your bag, we do have special scoops for this purpose in every paddock.
- Please note, Zimzala is a “GREEN” facility and only biodegradable poopbags may be disposed of on the property. Any plastic must accompany you home.
- If you find you do have to smoke on the premises, please dispose of cigarette butts in an appropriate manner - extinguish and throw in the rubbish bins. Please don’t throw them in the garden beds or on the paving areas. Cigarette butts pose a health risk to the free roaming birds that live on the property and seem to eat everything!
- Always drive slowly when entering the premises. There are free roaming animals such as squirrels, rabbits, peacocks, chickens, ducks, cats and resident dogs that live here and they are not traffic wise.

- Our aim is to make every dog and all handlers' training a safe, rewarding and enjoyable experience. Please assist us in this regard.
